

Larry N. Cohen Biography



Personal

Larry Neil Cohen was born in New York City in 1959. He is a former computer-programmer and options trader, but presently works exclusively in the world of bridge--lecturing in venues on land and sea, writing several best-selling bridge books and hundreds of articles. Larry has played bridge in a dozen different countries in special invitational tournaments. His biggest passion/hobby is golf (handicap 11). In 2009, Larry "semi-retired" from playing to focus on teaching and writing. He currently resides in Delray Beach, Florida with his lovely wife, Eugenia (Maria).

Bridge Career

Larry learned bridge at age 6 from his grandparents. He began playing duplicate at age 14 and was competing in tournaments by 15. By 17 he had earned the title of Life Master and by 22 he had won his first of **25 National Championships**. Among his titles are a Vanderbilt, two Spingolds, two Reisingers, two Life Master Pairs, and four Blue Ribbon Pairs. Additionally, he is also a two-time winner of The Cavendish Invitational Pairs, winner of the 1999 Cap Gemini World Top 16 Pairs Tournament in the Hague, Silver Medalist in 1998 World Pairs Championships, and Bronze Medalist in the 2000 Olympiad Teams. In 2002 **ACBL named him Player of the Year** and in 2011 named him Honorary Member of the Year. He is also listed on their **Top 10 Living Most Influential People in Bridge**. **In 2020, in his first year of eligibility, he was elected to the ACBL Hall of Fame.**

Books-CDs-DVDs

His best-selling book, *To Bid or Not to Bid--The LAW Of Total Tricks*, was published in six different languages. The sequel, *Following the LAW*, was also a best-seller. Between 2012 and 2017 Larry wrote six workbooks: *Larry Teaches 2/1 Game Force, Doubles and Redoubles, Opening Leads, Defense, Declarer Play at Notrump and Declarer Play at Suit Contracts*. In 2019 and 2020 he collaborated with David Bird on two books: *On the Other Hand* and *On the Other Hand - Defense*. In 2021 Larry wrote the trilogy *Modern Bidding I, II, III*. Larry has written and published the following CD's: *Play Bridge with Larry Cohen (1999 Life Master Pairs) -- Days 1,2,3, 2005 My Favorite 52, 2010 The Real Deal* for both Advanced and Intermediate players, and 2011 Audio CD: *Talking Bridge*. In 2017/18 he released 10 DVD's on several bridge subjects. All of the above are available on this website and **all are ABTA Award Winners!**

In March 2020 Larry and his team transitioned into live webinars with viewers from around the world. Recorded versions are available in the STORE at larryco.com
