Todd's Tips

Words of wisdom from Robert's lectures

We know that in order to preempt you have to know about things like suit quality and vulnerability, but have we been thinking about them wrong?

For suit quality, we often think of AKxxxx as a good suit, but it has the same number of losers opposite a singleton as QJ109xx. The J/10/9/8 of suits can make the difference between having a good suit and a bad suit so make sure you look past the honors.

For vulnerability, don't just consider whether you are vulnerable or not. Whether the opponents are vulnerable should also influence your decision. The most aggressive colors (vulnerability) is when you are not vulnerable (white) and the opponents are vulnerable (red). Since your opponents' game is worth 600 or 620, you could get doubled and go down 3 and still do better than letting them make a game. Next most aggressive is white vs white.

When vulnerable, you can still be reasonably aggressive at red vs red, but should be at your most conservative when you are vulnerable facing nonvulnerable opponents.
