#### **Words of wisdom from Robert Todd** After the opponents preempt, it's important to attempt to describe different types of hands. For instance, if the

describe different types of hands. For instance, if the opponents open  $2 \checkmark$  and you had intended to open  $2 \bigstar$ , what should you bid?

This is a trick question. There's an old teacher saying, "Don't preempt a preempt." With a weak hand, you should wait for the auction to develop. That means that a jump bid following an opponent's preempt is NOT weak. What is it then?

A jump bid tends to show a good overall hand, with offensive values in that suit. A  $3 \triangleq$  jump over a weak-two bid would typically be something like  $\clubsuit KQ10987 \P 7 \clubsuit A8$  $\clubsuit AKJ$ —a hand where you need just a little help from partner to make game. Double and then bidding a suit could be done with similar strength, but a less solid looking suit.

Advanced options include bids like the Western Cuebid (asking for a stopper in the opponent's suit), lebensohl or Leaping Michaels. Whatever you play, it's important to make sure partner is on the same page. If partner forgets lebensohl every time, maybe it's time to drop it from the convention card.
